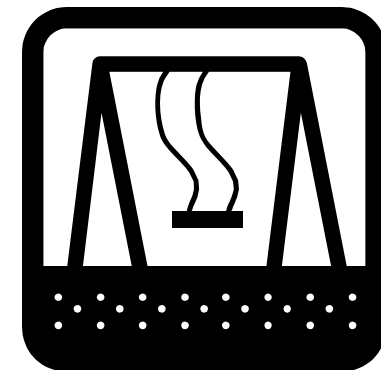

John McGovern, J.D.

John McGovern is the President of Recreation Accessibility Consultants LLC (RAC), a firm established in 2008. RAC is a member of the family of companies under the umbrella of W-T Engineering, a premier engineering firm in Illinois. RAC advises local parks and recreation agencies, counties, and states regarding compliance with the ADA with respect to existing and new buildings and sites and inclusive recreation support.

He has more than 30 years experience in parks and recreation, earning his law degree from Loyola University of Chicago School of Law while working in the field. He writes and speaks about the ADA and recreation frequently, consulting with organizations across the country. He is the co-founder of the successful National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) National Institute on Recreation Inclusion, now in its ninth year.

John has worked with state, county, and local governments as a consultant on access and inclusion. With his interest in the application of access concepts to real life situations, John published a handbook on ADA compliance for Illinois park districts in 1991 followed by a similar handbook for municipal parks and recreation agencies for the NRPA in 1992. Both publications are still in use today.

In 2005, the American Park & Recreation Society (APRS) recognized John with its Meritorious Service Professional Award. In 2008 he was selected by the American Academy of Parks & Recreation Administration as a "Legend" in Parks and Recreation.
